The Narrative

MESSAGE

- A. Interrogated by neighbours 9:8-12
 - 1. Jesus is absent from this part of the narrative
 - 2. Man's first opportunity to tell his story, not his initiative
 - 3. Not clear about who Jesus was (a man called Jesus) had not yet seen him

STUDY GUIDE

- B. Interrogated by Pharisees 9:13-17
 - 1. First how he received sight.
 - 2. Then what do you say about him (who is he)
 - 3. Man responds He's a prophet
- C. Parents questioned 9:18-23
 - 1. Due to unbelief of Pharisees
 - 2. Confirm he was born blind; don't know how he received sight
 - 3. Defer to their son due to fear
- D. Further interrogation 9:24-29
 - 1. "Give glory to God" tell the truth because you are lying
 - 2. "This man is a sinner."
- E. The man's long speech 9:30-33
 - 1. Jesus has disappeared and left the man on his own.
 - 2. Man repeats the facts of gaining his sight
 - 3. He taunts them

- 1. I told you already you won't listen
- 2. Do you want to become his disciples too?
- 4. An amazing thing
 - 1. You don't know where he comes from, yet he opened my eyes
 - 2. God doesn't listen to sinners
 - 3. God listens to the God-fearing and those who do his will
 - 4. Never before has a person born blind received sight
 - 5. This man (Jesus) is from God because he did this.
- 5. Result cast out
 - 1. You were born in sin
 - 2. You were blind due to sin.
 - 3. Cast out of society, excommunicated
- 6. Jesus finds the formerly blind man 9:35-41
 - A full progression in the man's faith: a man > a prophet > from God > the Son of Man > Lord > finally belief and worship

Application

- A. This incident is about more than a physical healing
 - 1. It is really a story of whether or not one has spiritual sight.
 - 2. We are all born without spiritual sight.
 - 3. The Pharisees who claim to see are actually blind because they do not believe Jesus to be the one sent by God.
 - 4. Lack of spiritual sight equals not believing and this is sin. 9:41
 - 1. Admitting we are blind is the first step toward seeing
 - 2. Refusing to believe keeps people in spiritual blindness and darkness
- B. Faith/belief is progressive
 - 1. It is a gift
 - 2. And it is something to be worked out/developed
 - 3. Faith and sight develop and grow: Man prophet from God Son of Man Lord believe and worship
- C. Faith grows amidst trials and adversity
 - 1. Through suffering and trials we gradually come to fuller faith
 - 2. The crucible of a fiery trial
 - 3. Healing which produces faith may lead to opposition and suffering
 - 4. Faith grows through testifying
 - 1. Jesus physical presence is not with us
 - 2. We are left to speak and testify for him.
 - 5. Warning: Some people's faith grows while other people become harder by continued resistance.
 - 1. Some have so many arguments against believing they put themselves in a corner.
 - 2. It is a refusal to believe.
 - "The same sun which melts wax hardens clay. And the same Gospel which melts some persons to repentance hardens others in their sins." ?Charles H. Spurgeon
