The Shepherd's Prayer For His Disciples

Bible Reading: John 17:6-19

- I. Background the disciples are about to be scattered by Jesus' death
- A. It is a prayer of a shepherd, not as a high priest
- B. Jesus is the Good Shepherd (John 10) who cares for his sheep
- 1. He is concerned for them as he is about to leave the earth
- 2. He is concerned that they will be scattered (16:32) so he prays for their oneness
- C. Praying to the Father with the disciples being present
- II. Jesus Reviews His ministry 17:6-8
- A. His mission
- 1. Revealing (manifesting) the Father's name to the disciples
- 2. They are given by the Father to the Son they are chosen
- 3. Jesus gave them the words from the Father
- B. The disciples' response
- 1. They have kept the Father's word v. 6
- 2. They know and believe v 8
- C. Jesus' positive view of the disciples
- III. Praying for their protection 17:9-16
- A. Jesus is glorified in them vv. 9-10
- B. "Holy Father, protect them by your name"
- 1. They are in the world while Jesus is leaving the world
- 2. That they may be one as the Father and Son are one- v. 11
- a. No indication of disharmony
- b. A unity of the flock under one Shepherd (10:16)
- c. A unity of the nature of the Son with the Father not legislated, not organized
- d. A unity that comes from our relationship with the Father and the Son
- 3. Jesus protected them while he was with them v. 12
- 4. Jesus gave them the Father's word and the world hated them because they are not of the world v. 14

- 5. Protect them from the evil one v. 15
- 6. They are not of the world v. 16
- 7. We are protected and kept by the Father
- IV. Praying for their commission 17:17-19
- A. Sanctify them by the truth
- 1. Sanctify set apart for a purpose, a commission, a special use
- 2. By the Truth (in the Truth) –
- B. They are being sent into the world
- C. Jesus sanctified Himself v. 19
- V. Jesus, as the Good Shepherd, has a positive perspective regarding his disciples
