Bible Reading: John 21:15-25

Sermon Summary:

It's a human impossibility to go through life & not disappoint or fail someone. It's no different as Christians. We fail Jesus so many times. And just like any other occasion of failure we feel the weight, guilt & shame of that failure. How does Jesus meet us where we are at with all the thoughts & feelings from our failure? John 21:15-19 gives us an inside look into how Jesus restored Peter after he denied him 3 times (Jn. 18:15-18, 25-27). But Jesus isn't only concerned with restoring us from our past failings. He also re-engages us in his mission to take care of people for him. That's right, there is a future for those who have failed! He asks us "Do U love me?" & we surely do. But that love can't just be lip service. It must be practiced by feeding & shepherding Jesus' sheep. I believe you love Jesus, but ask yourself, "who am I caring for, for Jesus?"

Discussion:

- 1. Describe in your own words how Peter must have felt & what his thoughts might have been about his denial of Jesus (Jn. 18:15-18, 25-27). To get a clearer picture, read Matt. 26:31, 33; Jn. 13:37-38. What kind of internal struggle did he face?
- 2. What are three reasons why we should not over interpret John's use of Greek words for love to Peter (agapao & phileo)?
- 3. When Jesus asked Peter, "Do you love me more than these?" What is 'these'? And how does the answer help Peter in his restoration?
- 4. Is it surprising to you that after such a massive failure Jesus still wants Peter back on mission for him? What might we typically think when we've messed up?
- 5. Loving Jesus is not just lip service. What is the practicality of our love for Jesus in these verses? How do we cary out our love for Jesus at CIT?
- 6. Jesus made it clear that Peter's discipleship would end in martyrdom & John's would not. He would live a long life as a witness to Jesus. Each of us has a path to follow Jesus on. Why is it dangerous for us to compare our following to others'?
- 7. Talk about how Jesus has restored you after a failure. What did it take for you to return to serving & caring for others after your failure? What helped you restart?

End with Prayer.

- Pray for our love for Jesus to burn brightly within our hearts.
- Pray for one another's concerns.
